Don't be afraid of talking to your professors if you need help. They have office hours for a reason!

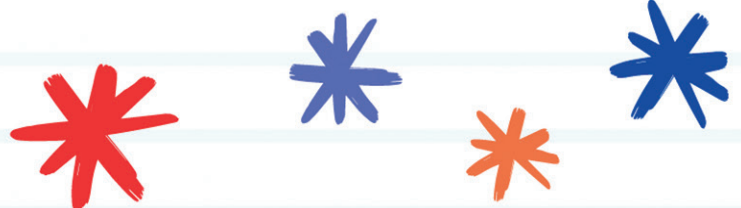
Don't make a habit out of pulling all-nighters, because the only thing you'll remember during the test is how much you need a nap.

Skyhawk card

What is it and what can it do?

The Skyhawk Card is the student ID card for UT Martin. It has your picture, name and student ID number (commonly called a “960” number) on it. The Skyhawk Card is basically your key to the campus.

How do you put money on it?

You have a couple of options. You can add money online: Banner Self Service> Student Services> Student Records> Online Payments and Deposits> Click for Online Payments> eDeposits. You could also add money at one of the card reloading stations (cash only), found in the Boling University Center and the Paul Meek Library.

What happens if you lose or break it?

You need to report the loss immediately to the Skyhawk Card Office, located at the One Stop Shop in Clement Hall. If the office is not open, report the loss to Public Safety. If your card gets broken or damaged in a way that isn't from normal wear and tear, the Skyhawk Card Office will charge \$25 for a new card.

What if it stops working?

If the electronic swipe on the back of your card gets too scratched or worn out, a new card can be retrieved for free (up to two cards) from the Skyhawk Card Office.

* Captain's Cash

Captain's Cash can be used to purchase food anywhere on campus except for vending machines. Funds placed in this account are non-refundable. Unused Captain's Cash from the fall semester will roll over into the spring semester; however, any unused funds left over at the end of spring semester will be lost.

* Skyhawk Silver

Skyhawk Silver can be used anywhere on campus, including the Bookstore and at vending machines, as well as at all on-campus dining locations and several off-campus locations. Funds in this account roll over each semester, and can be withdrawn at any time for a service fee of \$15. The fee is waived if the money is withdrawn upon graduation.

* The Bookstore

One option on the Skyhawk Card is a Book Advance. This is taken out of your refund check and can only be used to buy books at UT Martin's Barnes & Noble Bookstore.

* All-around access

The Skyhawk Card provides access to residence halls, the Student Rec Center, labs if professors register door access, and university Athletics events (free admission.) The card also doubles as a library card – it can be used to check out books, computers or movies in the Paul Meek Library, or can be used for photocopying and printing. If you live in one of the residence halls, the card allows you to check out the key to the kitchen and the card also can be used to do laundry.

Crime Prevention Tips

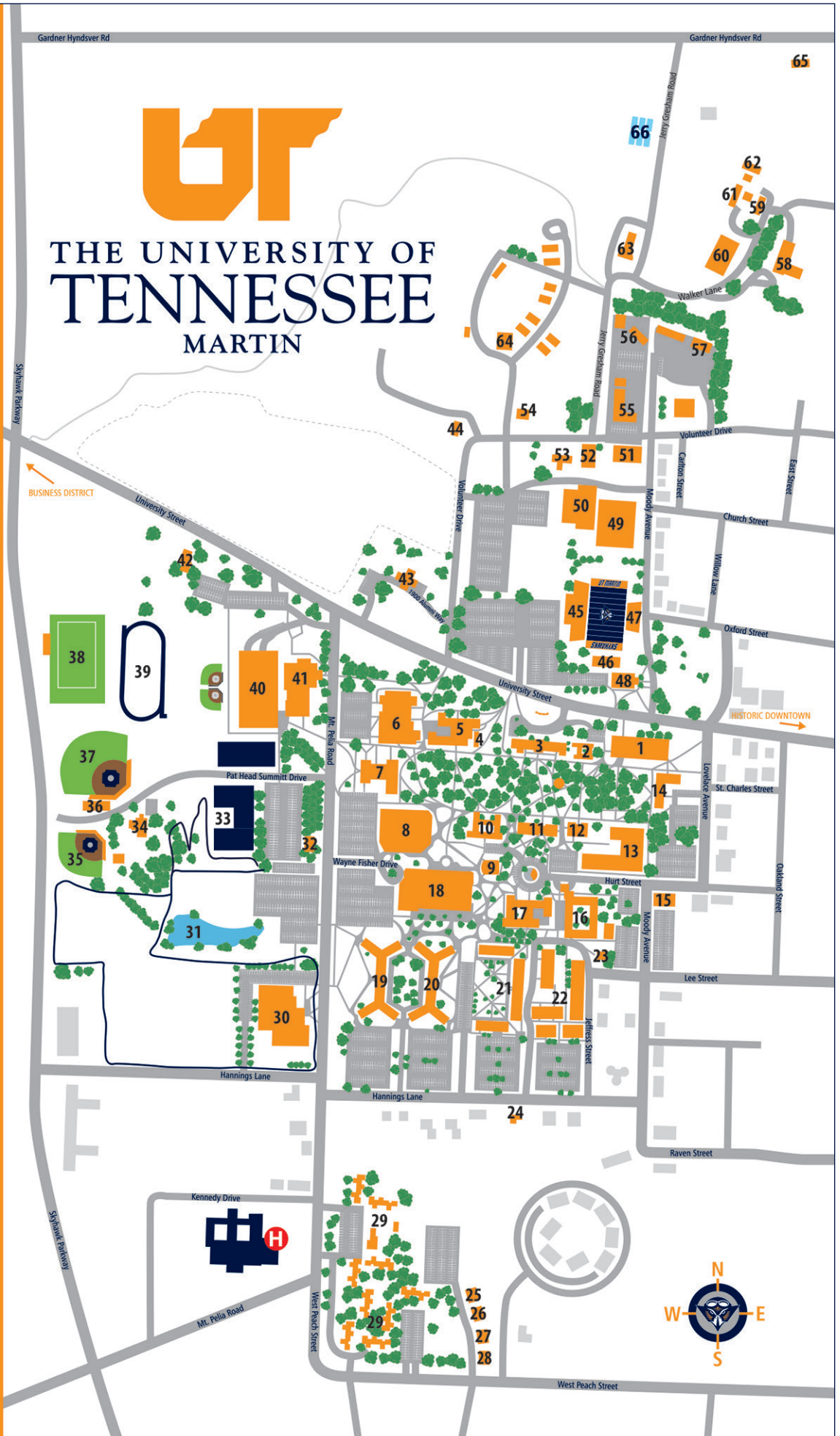
Walking around campus:

- Familiarize yourself with the layout of the campus.
- Carry your cellphone and have it readily available.
- Plan the safest route to where you are going – choose well-lighted busy pathways.
- Avoid shortcuts between buildings or off busy pathways.
- If possible, travel in groups.
- Know where the emergency call boxes are located and how to use them.
- Stay alert to your surroundings and recognize potential threats as soon as possible.
- Tell a friend where you are going and how long it should take you to get there.
- Trust your instincts. If something makes you feel nervous, leave the area immediately.

Living in your residence:

- Always lock your door!
- Do not open your door unless you know who is out there.
- Do not prop any exterior or end-hallway doors open.
- Report any stolen/lost residential facility keys to the Housing staff immediately.
- Report any damaged or malfunctioning locks.
- Secure your valuables and don't leave them out in the open.
- Record the serial number and description of your personal equipment and secure the inventory in case your property is stolen.
- Mark your equipment/valuables with a personal ID symbol (not your date of birth or Social Security number).
- Report any suspicious activity or people immediately.
- Remind your neighbors to lock up and use security precautions, as well.

To get to the offices, turn right in the lobby of the One Stop Shop in Clement Hall and take the elevator to the first floor, where you will see this sign. You may also enter from the west door of Clement Hall and follow the signs.

Mail Services and Digital Printing occupy two locations on the ground floor of Clement Hall. **Mail Services**, housed across the hall from Digital Printing, has mailboxes nearby for residents of Arnold Pryor Place, Conner Community and University Courts. Designated dorm mail clerks pick up, sort and distribute mail to the other residence halls by 2 p.m. weekdays. The daily departure time for outgoing mail is noon. The office also sells stamps and envelopes, and can ship priority and first-class packages. **Digital Printing**, which is in room 101, offers design services and will print invitations, business cards, banners, posters, brochures, flyers, envelopes, desk nameplates, yard signs and vinyl lettering. The office also provides binding and finishing services, laminating and large-format banners.

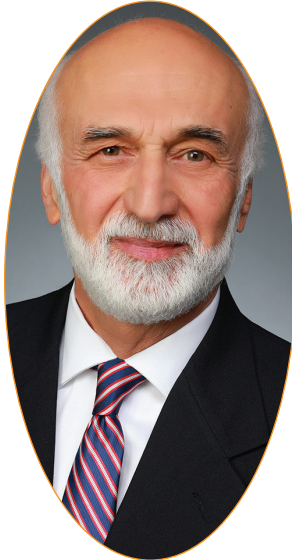

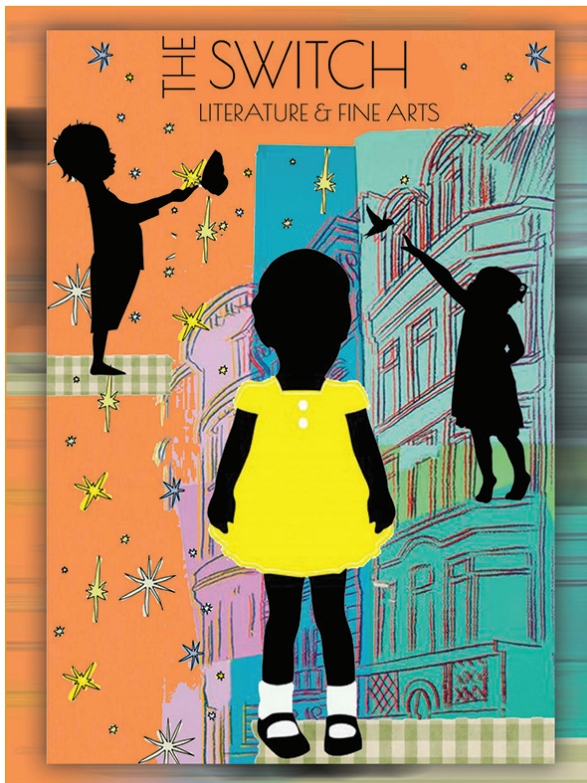

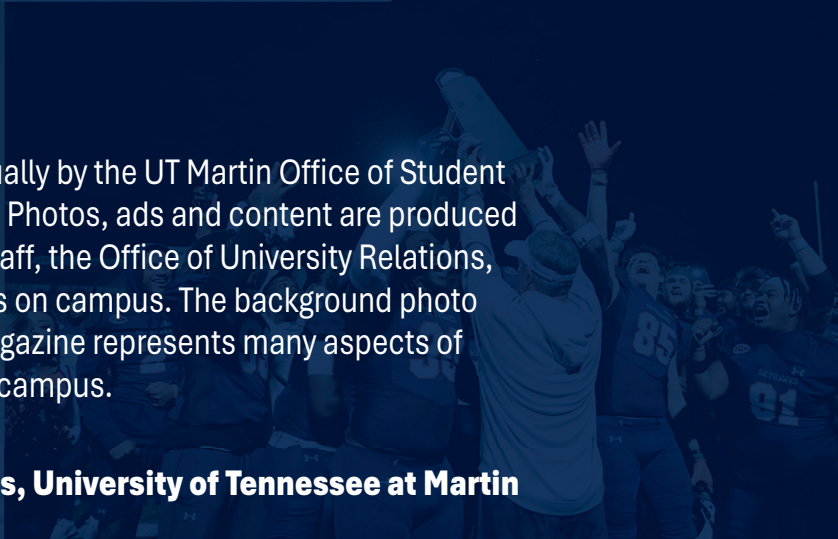
